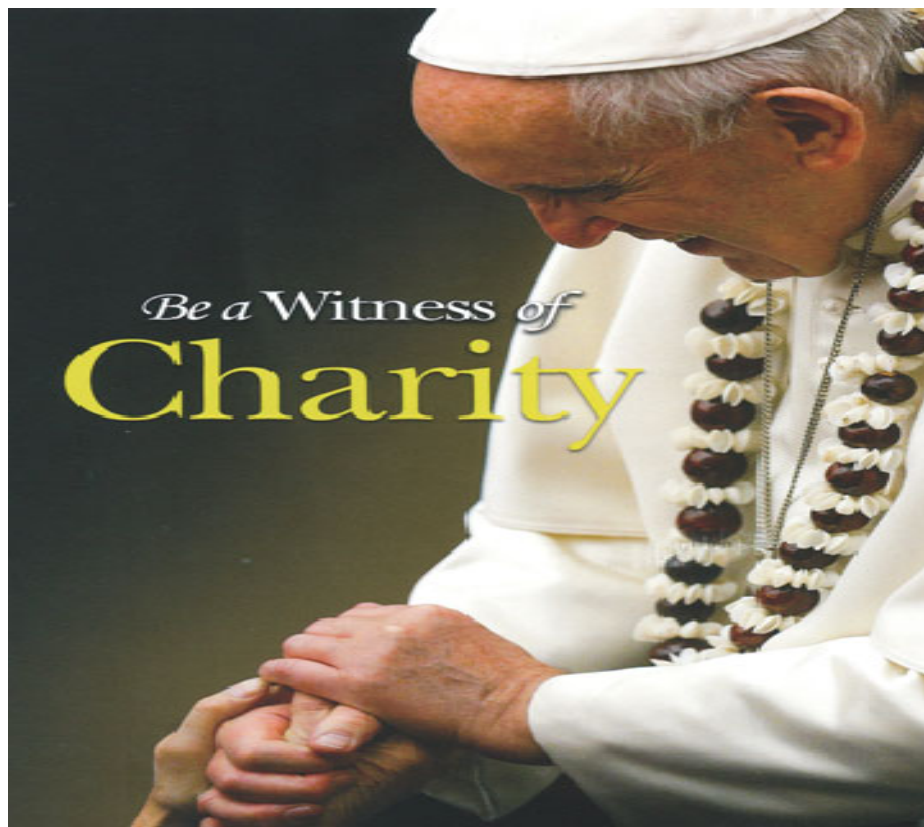

From the Pastor

Happy Birthday John the Baptist! It is a rare thing for us to celebrate the birthday of a saint in the liturgical calendar. In fact, there are only three of great prominence: Jesus Our Lord (Dec. 25), Mary, Mother of God (Sept. 8), and St. John the Baptist (June 24). It is easy to understand the significance of Jesus' and Mary' birthdays but why John the Baptist?

John's birthday is significant for us because of several reasons. Let's look at what the scripture itself says of him. My comments will be in red. The following passage comes from Luke 1:5-17.

In the days of Herod, King of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah of the priestly division of Abijah; his wife was from the daughters of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. Both were righteous in the eyes of God, observing all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blamelessly. But they had no child, because Elizabeth was barren and both were advanced in years. Once when he was serving as priest in his division's turn before God, according to the practice of the priestly service, he was chosen by lot to enter the sanctuary of the Lord to burn incense. Then, when the whole assembly of the people was praying outside at the hour of the incense offering, the angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right of the altar of incense.

Zechariah was troubled by what he saw, and fear came upon him. But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, because your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall name him John. **The name "John" means "The Lord has shown favor". And has he ever!** And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of [the] Lord.

He will drink neither wine nor strong drink. **Like Samson and Samuel, John will be consecrated to God and set apart to do his work.** He will be filled with the holy Spirit even from his mother's womb, **which we see when Mary visits Elizabeth and John leaps in his mother's womb at the presence of Jesus** and he will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God. He will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah to turn the hearts of fathers toward children and the disobedient to the understanding of the righteous, to prepare a people fit for the Lord." **John is to be the forerunner, the long prophesied prophet who is to prepare the way for the Messiah. The prophet Malachi describes the role of one who would come in the power of Elijah, the greatest prophet of the Old Testament, to prepare the people for "the great and terrible day of the Lord."**

In the end, the Old Testament comes to a close with this long prophesied forerunner of the Messiah. John is set apart for service to God by preparing a way for the Lord. He prepares the people through his preaching, the baptism of repentance and finally, through his pointing out the Messiah. "Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world."

80 MORE FAMILIES PLEDGE & JOIN OUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN!

Thank you to our Ground Breaking Celebration Co-Chairs Toni Rechsteiner & Karen Tuzinkiewicz, Bishop John Dolan and all the volunteers for making June 3rd such a special day! Since that time, we're up to 284 families who have pledged \$1,462,309 -- that's 9.2% of our parish accounting for 42% of our \$3.5 million goal to fund Phase 2 of our master plan. While we've received pledges and gifts of up to \$130,000, our average family pledge is about \$150/mo for 40 months. DEL PASTOR

¡Feliz cumpleaños Juan el Bautista! No es común que celebremos el cumpleaños de un santo en el calendario litúrgico. De hecho, solo hay tres de gran importancia: Jesús Nuestro Señor (25 de diciembre), María, Madre de Dios (8 de septiembre) y San Juan el Bautista (24 de junio). Es fácil entender el significado de los cumpleaños de Jesús y María, pero ¿por qué Juan el Bautista?

El cumpleaños de Juan es significativo para nosotros por varias razones. Miremos lo que la escritura misma dice de Él. Mis comentarios estarán en rojo. El siguiente pasaje proviene de Lucas 1: 5-17.

En los días de Herodes, rey de Judea, había un sacerdote llamado Zacarías, de la división sacerdotal de Habías; su esposa era de las hijas de Aarón, y su nombre era Elizabeth. Ambos fueron justos ante los ojos de Dios, observando todos los mandamientos y ordenanzas del Señor sin culpa. Pero no tuvieron hijos, porque Elizabeth era estéril y ambos habían avanzado en años. Una vez, cuando estaba sirviendo como sacerdote en el turno de su división ante Dios, según la práctica del servicio sacerdotal, fue elegido por sorteo para entrar en el santuario del Señor y quemar incienso. Entonces, cuando toda la asamblea del pueblo estaba orando fuera a la hora de la ofrenda del incienso, se le apareció el ángel del Señor, que estaba a la derecha del altar del incienso.

Zacarías estaba preocupado por lo que vio, y el temor vino sobre él. Pero el ángel le dijo: "No temas, Zacarías, porque tu oración ha sido escuchada. Tu esposa Elizabeth te dará a luz un hijo, y lo llamarás Juan. **El nombre "Juan" significa "El Señor ha mostrado favor". ¡Y no lo ha hecho alguna otra vez! Y tendrás alegría y felicidad, y muchos se regocijarán de su nacimiento, porque Él será grande a los ojos [del] Señor.**

No beberá vino ni bebida fuerte. **Al igual que Sansón y Samuel, Juan se consagrará a Dios y se apartará para hacer su trabajo.** Él será lleno del Espíritu Santo incluso desde el vientre de su madre, **que vemos cuando María visita a Isabel y Juan salta en el vientre de su madre ante la presencia de Jesús y Él convertirá a muchos de los hijos de Israel al Señor su Dios.** Él irá delante de Él en el espíritu y el poder de Elías para volver los corazones de los padres hacia los hijos y los desobedientes a la comprensión de los justos, para preparar a un pueblo digno de Jehová. **"Juan debe ser el precursor, el profetizado largo profeta que preparará el camino para el Mesías. El profeta Malaquías describe el papel de alguien que vendría en el poder de Elijah, el más grande profeta del Antiguo Testamento, para preparar al pueblo para "el gran y terrible día del Señor".**

Al final, el Antiguo Testamento llega a su fin con este profeta precursor del Mesías. Juan se aparta para servir a Dios preparando un camino para el Señor. Él prepara al pueblo a través de su predicación, el bautismo de arrepentimiento y, finalmente, a través de su señalamiento del Mesías. "He aquí el Cordero de Dios. He aquí el que quita los pecados del mundo".
